Nurse Compact License

I understand that I may practice in North Carolina under a compact license if I hold an unencumbered nursing license in my permanent state of residency if that state is a compact state.

I also understand that if I become a permanent resident of North Carolina I must obtain a North Carolina Nursing License. As stated by the NC Board of Nursing, "Primary state of residence' as defined by the Compact means 'the person's declared fixed permanent and principal home for legal purposes; domicile'. Sources of proof that the boards of nursing may use to verify primary residence include one's IRS tax return, voter registration or driver's license."

The NC Board of Nursing states that "A Nurse changing primary state of residence form one compact state to another compact state may continue to practice under the former home state license for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days".
